## **Survey Methodology**

- Researched existing surveys on Air Pollution.
- Developed questionnaire in English.
- A total of 57 Questions, including 8 demographic questions.
- Translated to Hindi
- Converted to a mobile application.
- Date collected through in-person interview by survey team, who filled the responses into the app.








### **Survey Area**

#### Delhi - NCR



- Delhi was divided into 7 zones as per Delhi
   Parliamentary Constituencies
- 11 Busy metro stations were taken from 7
   Parliamentary Constituencies.
- 4 Busy metro stations from Ghaziabad, Noida,
   Gurgaon, and Faridabad (One from each).
- Data was collected within a 1km radius from all metro stations.
- Data also collected from urban slums in the radius of the metro stations.
- Data also collected from 2 Public Schools from students of 9<sup>th</sup> Standard – 12<sup>th</sup> Standard.










# Air Quality Index/Measuring Related Questions





## How will you rate your city's air quality?






More than half (57.7%) of the respondents rated the air quality in their city as bad (36.2%) or very bad (21.5%).






## How will you rate your city's air quality?

4.3% Often



## Are you aware of the Air Quality Index (AQI)?




**83.6%** of respondents were unaware about AQI.










### Do you know the difference between PM2.5 and PM10?




92.2% of total respondents didn't know the difference between PM2.5 and PM10.






### How would you rank the air pollution level in the following quarters?

# Is air quality perceived through optical quality of air?





### Do you think air pollution has an impact on your health?




**Majority of the respondents (82.2%)** 

respondents say that air pollution has an impact on their health.






### Which organs do you think are affected by air pollution? (Multiple choices)







# Have you or any of your relatives visited the hospital due to respiratory discomfort (asthma/cough) in the last one year?






38.8% of respondents have visited the hospital due to respiratory discomfort in the last one year.





# Are you aware of the health warning being given by the State or Central Government in winter when air pollution increases?




**51.8% of the respondents** were aware of the health warning being given by the State or Central Government.





# Are you aware of any public health emergencies issued by the Government of Delhi on account of extremely poor air quality in the last two years?




Only 31.4% respondents were aware of any public health emergencies issued by the Government of Delhi.

Is public aware of the extent of health impacts of bad Air Quality?





# Do you know of any program or initiative undertaken by the local Government to tackle air pollution in your city?




**78.1%** were not aware of Local Government's initiatives undertaken to reduce air pollution.





### Are you aware of the National Clean Air Programme?




**78.9% respondents do not know about** the National Clean Air Programme.

**18.9%** Central Government


8.5% Weekly

**49.9% of** respondents listed vehicular emissions as the first source of air pollution.


28.4% of respondents listed waste burning as the second source.

20.2% listed industries/factories as the third source






# Have you, at any point, considered any of the following individual behavioural changes to reduce air pollution?

Are we engaging the public to formulate and implement policies and initiatives related to clean air?






